
A Brief History of The Journey Church



Sonora, Nov 22nd 1857 Pursuant to notice a meeting was held at the House of C.L. Street in Sonora at 3 oclock P.M. the above date, by the friends favorable to the organization of a Baptist Church, to take into consideration the expediency and practicibility of said object.

Nov 22, 1857 – formally organized with Rev. C. King as Pastor. Services held at county court house. C.L. Street was a prominent figure in the organization and funding of the new church.

1860 – Began meeting at corner of Elkin St and N. Stewart; building now houses Aronos Club.

- **Note of Interest:** William Sugg, a former slave who bought his own freedom, helped to build FBC; his grandson helped build the second church.¹
- Feb 28, 1880 Jan 12, 1884 Rev. Andrew Judson Sturtevant served as Pastor. Lived in parsonage at 61 Snell St. Left due to "bickering and petty problems among the congregation."²
- May 27, 1897 building destroyed by fire; later rebuilt
- **1936** Lowest recorded offering: 7 cents! Congregation disbanded, selling the property at Elkin & Stewart to the Aronos Club for \$750.
- **1959** Church reconstituted and adopted original church covenant, eventually meeting at Seventh Day Adventist Church located at Hope Lane and Jackson St.
- **1964** Purchased SDA property. (Did the purchase ever go through?)
- **1967** Purchased property and built current church at 14425 Mono Way.
- **1998** Ray Shopp called as Pastor with his wife, Helen.
- **2011** Name changed to The Journey, A Church Pursuing Jesus (dba only; official name is still First Baptist Church of Sonora).
- **2014** Pastor Ray retired.
- **2018** Randy Ehle called as Lead Pastor with his wife, Eiley.
